FLOOR SCHEDULE AND PROCEDURE

H.R. 6 – Energy Policy Act of 2003 (Structured Rule). The House will continue consideration of the pending amendments to H.R. 6.

Remaining Amendments

- **Schakowsky Amendment (Rolled Vote)** - Sense of Congress on having more stringent inventory and procurement controls by the Department of Energy.
- **Capps/Miller (FL)/Davis (FL)** (20 minutes) - Regarding protections for sensitive coastal areas;
- **Kind** (20 minutes) Regarding oil and gas development provisions;
- **Rahall** (20 minutes) - Regarding Federal coal leasing;
- **Thomas** (10 minutes) - Regarding the prepayment of premium liability for coal industry health benefits;
- **Reynolds/Rogers (MI)** (10 minutes) - Regarding the Great Lakes States prohibition on Great Lakes off-shore oil and gas drilling.
